




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EU policy and the common agricultural policy (CAP)

- The CAP doesn't function as income support
- The CAP should not support large-scale livestock production
- Subsidise plant-based food production via the CAP
- Subsidise sustainable and more extensive dairy and meat production via the CAP
- CAP is an important source of financing for the green transition











Research and development

- Research and development into protein crops for human consumption should be prioritised and expedited
- Develop technologies that improve texture, taste, and nutritional value in plant-based food products
